July 2022

Abortion Campaign

In July, we carried out a campaign focusing on abortion. The aim of the campaign was to increase understanding of abortion around the world, with a particular emphasis on the global overview of safe abortions and access to emergency contraception. On September 19th, Hear My Voice- Women's Network, in partnership with Dare for the Future Initiative and EduInCrisis, to host a webinar titled Girls and Women's Access to Education in Africa-A Post Pandemic Crisis. We had 4 incredible panelists, representing 4 different countries in Africa, speaking on the topic; providing an in-depth background to the issue of girl's access to education in

their country, challenges faced and practical solutions to increasing girls access in the future. This discussion was very timely, as the current situation regarding girls' access to education must be addressed to ensure that girls have access to opportunities in the future. Over 50 participants from across the world joined us for the insightful and thought provoking discussion.

"This event helped me to realise that the barriers preventing girls' education are similar across Africa and the solutions must focus on changing the mindsets of self, parents and communities." "I learned from the event that gender inequality is a key factor in girls' access to education. This inequality must be addressed starting with mindset change towards girl child education."
